## **Message from the President**

Since we are approaching the end of this year, perhaps we should start thinking about 2019. What do we need to do better? From 1845 to 1861, large numbers of Freethinkers from Germany settled in the Texas hill country, founding several communities that were often without churches and other influences of organized religion. Modern-day freethinkers in Texas celebrate this heritage by organizing Freethought Festivals and they have also worked very hard to erect a permanent cenotaph commemorating the German settlers of yesteryear.
